
STUDY GUIDE



ABOUT THE STORY

Balagaan and his cousins' clan had lived in harmony with the environment and their neighbours for thousands of years, but all that was about to change.

While Balagaan is banished, his cousin, Yirinyin, faces his own trials. While the Elders talk, Balagaan is summoned home, where he learns that Gawngan is betrothed to his rival, a bully, from another clan. Balagaan ignores the news of the sighting of the Newcomers, thinking of only one thing: his love for his childhood sweetheart.
